WEBTO created a program that teaches women market-driven job skills in such areas as cosmetology, tailoring, embroidery, and accounting.

The women are taught these skills over a six-month course that prepare them to enter the job market, start their own business, and provide for themselves and their family. This type of education is so important. With the right knowledge and tools, anything is possible. These women want to learn and help themselves, but sometimes do not know where to start.
