The Zamani Foundation

donated \$2,415 and 400 hours of volunteer service as part of its work with the North Shore Community Land Trust's preservation of the Paumalū Beach Park (Sunset Beach Park), Kahuku Point, Pūpūkea Paumalū

State Park Reserve, Sunset Ranch, Turtle Bay
Mauka Agricultural Lands, North Shore Greenprint,
and the development of the North Shore Coastal
Trail Plan.



Statistics

“Our work included construction of three access walkways at designated points along Sunset Beach Park, routes that will help mitigate erosion related to foot traffic and alleviate local ecosystem pressure.”

There are roughly 30 miles of shoreline, numerous native Hawaiian cultural sites, and an abundance of plant and wildlife that rely on the natural ecosystems within.

The Zamani Foundation funds were allocated for the protection, stewardship, awareness, and enhancement natural landscapes in O’ahu. Since its founding, the North Shore Community Land Trust has helped to conserve and steward thousands of acres of open space filled with forested hillsides and coastal farms, naupaka shaded beaches and coconut groves, grassy meadows, and wind-swept vistas — keeping 4,000 acres of land safe from destruction.
